Guidelines: Attend a book study with AASR, and submit a certificate to show your attendance. Then write a two to three-page reflection paper that includes the following: a summary of the book, your personal reflections and ideas about the book, and an plan for implementation in your family, school, or organization. For a certificate and to earn a graduate credit, you must achieve a minimum of **10 points**.

Note: If you do not achieve a minimum of 10, you may revise and resubmit the paper up to a total of three times.
